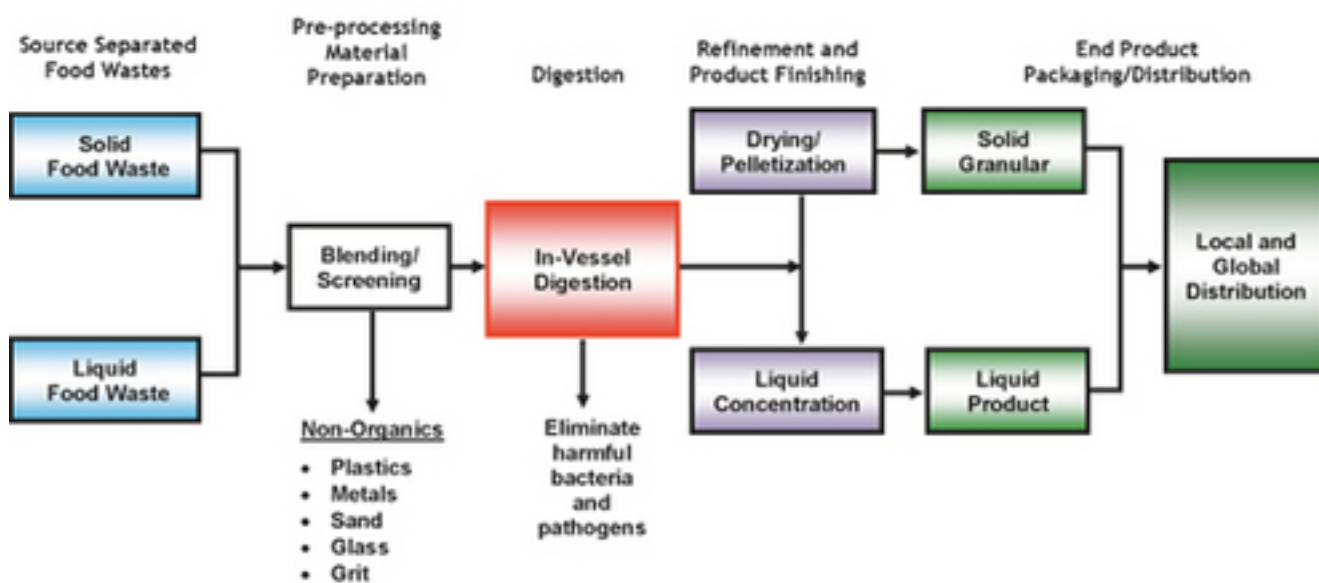


Converted Organics moves ahead on R.I. facility

Converted Organics Inc. of Boston said today that J.M. Coull Inc., a construction company based in Maynard, has been selected as the construction manager for development of the company's new organic fertilizer manufacturing facility in Johnston, R.I.
